Biography of Robert T. Hatt

Robert T. Hatt was a member of the Purdue University Class of 1923. He was a member of Phi Kappa Psi. The records that are available do not indicate that he graduated from Purdue. His father was William Kendrick Hatt who was a Professor of Civil Engineering at Purdue. The scrapbook has numerous mementos of Robert Hatt's days at Purdue, with a strong emphasis on Phi Kappa Psi, R.O.T.C., photographs of campus life and other ephemera relating to his time as a Purdue student.

After a thorough search, little information could be found, other than what was in the scrapbook.

Collection Description

Scope

The Robert T. Hatt scrapbook (ca, 1894-1940; 0.275 cubic feet) contains many photographs of campus life, predominantly during 1919-1920. There is a concentration of memorabilia from Phi Kappa Psi, since Hatt was a member of that fraternity. The scrapbook also contains newspaper clippings, along with ephemera, such as programs, ticket stubs, and other assorted odds and ends. Many of the items are not dated, which makes it difficult to ascertain the exact time period, especially for the photographs. The scrapbook is organized into three series:

Arrangement

1.Photographs, ca, 1894-1925 (0.2 cubic feet)

There is a strong concentration of photographs of Phi Kappa Psi members and events, along with campus buildings, students, R.O.T.C., including the military band and football activities. Materials in all of the series are arranged as they appear in the scrapbook.

2. Newspaper Clippings, ca. 1919-1924 (0.05 cubic feet)

Most of the newspaper clippings are related to Phi Kappa Psi events and members, along with Purdue football, basketball and R.O.T.C, including the military band.

3. Ephemera, ca. 1919-1940 (0.025 cubic feet)

Most of the ephemera consists of ticket stubs, programs and invitations relating to Phi Kappa Psi, convocations and athletic events.
